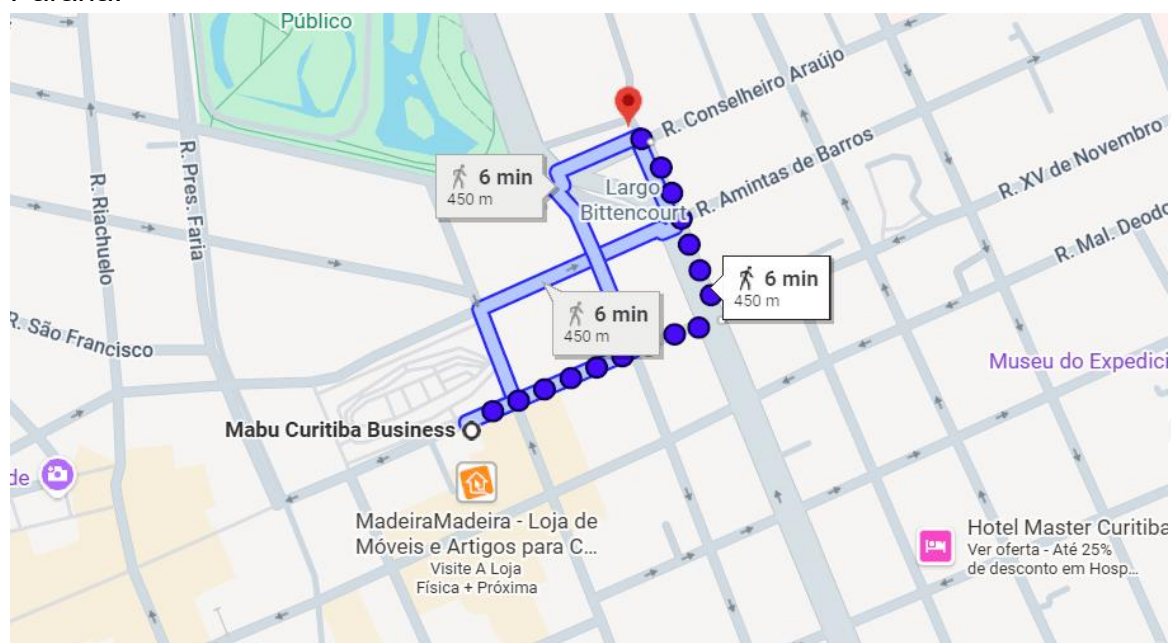

“Alain Fumaz

Born in 1950, he is married with two children and two grandchildren. His professional life, from which he is now retired, was spent in the French National Navy, where he served for 30 years and rose to the rank of senior officer. He is a Knight of the Legion of Honor, a Knight of the National Order of Merit, and a recipient of the National Defense Medal. He served as a Naval Attaché at the French Embassy in Peru, where he practiced Spanish and began his particular relationship with the American continent.

From 2008 until this year, he served as a City Councilor in the Municipality of La Garde, his city of residence, in the Mediterranean Provence Region.

With an extensive Masonic life, he served as the 1st Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Orient of France and was in charge of International Relations for that Masonic Obedience.

In 2009, the then President of CIMAS (Inter-American Confederation of Symbolic Masonry), Elbio Laxalte Terra, presented the Distinction of Honor to the Grand Orient of France, with Alain Fumaz serving as the Guarantor of Friendship between that Masonic Obedience and the Freemasonry of our continent. A 33rd Degree member of Philosophical Scottish Rite Masonry, he was the Grand Chancellor of the Grand College of Scottish Rites – Supreme Council of the 33rd Degree of the Grand Orient of France, the second oldest Supreme Council in the world, founded in 1805. This Jurisdiction joined the American Federation of Supreme Councils of the AASR (FASCREAA) in 2017 during its Assembly in Villavicencio, Colombia. Alain Fumaz strongly collaborated with the creation—in Cuenca, Ecuador, in 2019—of the Continental Conference of Humanist Scottish Jurisdictions of the Americas (CCJEHA), a member of the Intercontinental Encounters of Humanist Scottish Jurisdictions (RIJEH), which strengthened the international presence of American Scottish Jurisdictions.”

8. About Curitiba

Welcome to Curitiba! This information sheet was prepared to guide your visit to the capital of Paraná in September 2026, focusing on logistics, leisure, and gastronomy.

Arriving in Curitiba

Afonso Pena International Airport (CWB), located in São José dos Pinhais, is the main gateway, situated approximately 18 km from the center of Curitiba.

Main International Flights (Direct/Non-stop):

- [Santiago](#) (Chile): Operated by Latam and JetSmart.
- [Buenos Aires](#) (Argentina): Operated by Aerolíneas Argentinas, Gol and JetSmart.
- [Assunção](#) (Paraguai): Operated by Azul.
- [Montevideú](#) (Uruguai): Operated by Azul.
- [Lima](#) (Peru): Operated by Latam.
- [Lisboa](#) (Portugal): Scheduled to begin in July 2026 by TAP.

Other international routes typically have connections in São Paulo (Guarulhos Airport) or Rio de Janeiro (Galeão Airport).

How to get from Afonso Pena International Airport to downtown Curitiba.
Getting there is simple and offers good options:

Uber / 99 / Rideshare apps

- Transit time: 30 - 40 minutes, depending on traffic
- Average cost: R\$ 45 to R\$ 80
- Where to pick up: On the ground floor, right at the arrivals exit.
- Note: The most practical and widely used option today, especially for those with luggage.

Táxi

- Transit time: 30 to 40 minutes, depending on traffic
- Average cost: R\$ 90 a R\$ 120
- Pick up location: Official taxi stand located on the ground floor, right at the arrivals exit
- Note: More expensive than Uber, but available 24/7 and no app is required

City Bus (Conventional)

- Transit time: 1h15 to 1h40
- Cost: about R\$ 6
- Line: Line E32 – Terminal Boqueirão ↔ Aeroporto Afonso Pena
- Pick up location: At the arrivals terminal exit, in the outdoor area, at the marked city/metropolitan bus stop



- Note: Less practical for tourists, especially those with luggage, as it requires transfers and can be confusing

Important:

Transit times may vary depending on traffic conditions at the time of your trip. The prices provided are estimates and subject to change, especially for rideshare apps which use dynamic pricing.

Payments:

We recommend that payments for services such as Uber, hotels, restaurants, and commercial establishments be made using an international credit card. The circulation of foreign currency is extremely limited in Curitiba.

Where to Exchange Currency (Recommended Locations)

Most currency exchange offices in Curitiba operate Monday through Friday, from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM. However, locations within shopping malls usually open on Saturdays and Sundays.

- **Shopping Malls (Greater Security and Convenience)**
 - **Shopping Mueller & Shopping Curitiba:** Sidney Câmbio and DayCâmbio operate at these central points, offering easy access for those staying in the Centro Cívico or Batel neighborhoods.
- **Downtown and Historical Sector**
 - **Shopping Itália:** Flex Câmbio is recognized for competitive rates and fast service in the heart of the city.
 - **Comendador Araújo Street:** AVS Câmbio (inside Shopping Omar) handles a wide range of foreign currencies.
- **Afonso Pena International Airport**
 - There are **Confidence** and Cotação **DTVM** counters in the passenger terminal. These are practical for immediate exchanges upon arrival, although rates may be less favorable than at street-level shops.

Tourist Attractions and Culture

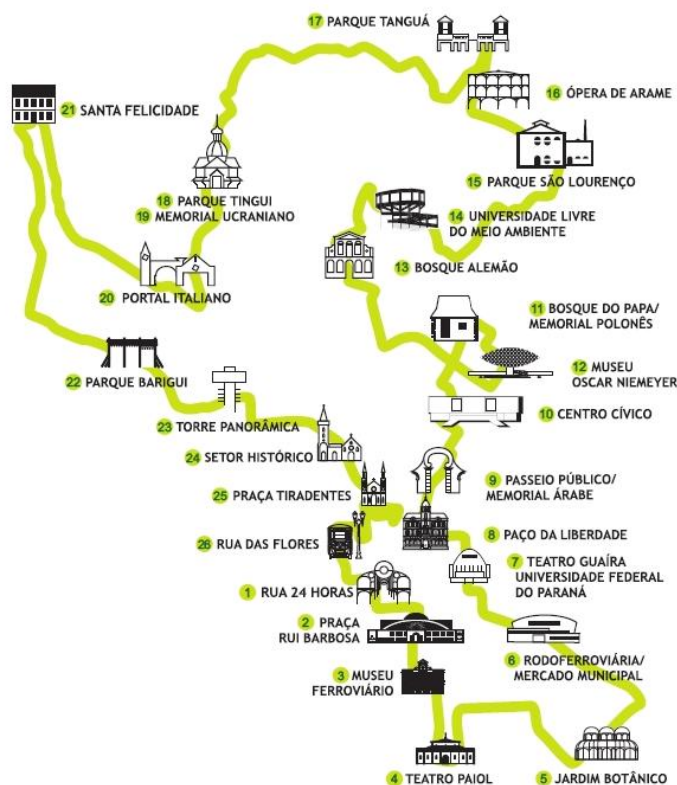
City Sightseeing Bus (Linha Turismo) — R\$ 50.00

One of the best ways to explore Curitiba is by boarding one of the double-decker buses of the Linha Turismo. This special route passes through the city's main landmarks, including



parks, museums, theaters, lookouts, cultural spaces, the historical center, the gastronomic district, ethnic memorials, and the newly renovated Municipal Market.

Curitiba is world-renowned for its urban planning and green areas.

- **Botanical Garden (Jardim Botânico)** The city's postcard landmark, featuring a glass greenhouse inspired by London's Crystal Palace.
- **Oscar Niemeyer Museum (MON)** Known as the "Eye Museum," it is one of the largest art museums in Latin America.
- **Wire Opera House (Ópera de Arame)** A theater built with tubular structures and a polycarbonate roof in the middle of a deactivated quarry.
- **Tanguá Park Offers** one of the most beautiful sunsets in the city, featuring gardens and a waterfall.
- **Largo da Ordem Street Fair** Takes place on Sundays in the historic center; ideal for local handicrafts and street food.

Curitiba offers a sophisticated blend of European tradition and cosmopolitan modernity, ideal for international tourists in 2026. For an authentic experience, it is recommended to explore the districts of **Batel** (sophistication), **São Francisco** (historic bohemian vibe), and **Santa Felicidade** (Italian heritage).



Fine Dining and Unique Experiences

These locations are ideal for tourists seeking signature menus, panoramic views, or the pinnacle of internationally recognized local cuisine.

- **Manu Restaurant** Led by award-winning chef Manu Buffara, it is the definitive choice for elite gastronomic tourism, ranking among the best in Latin America with a focus on local and seasonal ingredients.
- **Terrazza 40** Located in the Bigorriho neighborhood, it is the city's highest panoramic restaurant. It offers a stunning 360° view and is highly sought after for romantic dinners and special occasions.
- **Marcondes Cozinha Autoral** Situated in Cabral, it provides a contemporary experience focused on tasting menus paired by sommeliers, ideal for demanding palates.
- **Curitiba Municipal Market** Essential for daytime visits, where tourists can try the "pastel de pinhão" (made with a typical regional nut) and explore a wide variety of Brazilian spices and artisanal products.
- **Santa Felicidade** An Italian-colonized neighborhood famous for its pasta and polenta rodízios (all-you-can-eat). **Madalosso** restaurant is a traditional stop.
- **Exploring Batel** The Batel neighborhood concentrates the most sophisticated bars, restaurants, and a vibrant nightlife.

Tradition and Local Culture

Locations that preserve the city's historical identity, from colonization to bohemian customs.

- **Família Madalosso** Located in **Santa Felicidade**, it is one of the largest restaurants in the world and a landmark of Italian immigration, serving the traditional "rodízio" of pasta, polenta, and fried chicken (*frango a passarinho*).
- **Quintal do Monge** Situated in Largo da Ordem (Historical Sector), it offers a rustic atmosphere with local craft beers and traditional finger foods, ideal for experiencing the historic center's energy.
- **Bar do Alemão** A must-visit stop in the Historic Center to try the "Submarino" (a draft beer with a shot of Steinhäger) and classic German cuisine.

Nightlife: Jazz, Cocktails, and Vibrancy

Curitiba's nightlife is diverse, concentrated mainly in the Batel and São Francisco neighborhoods.

- **Full Jazz Bar** In the heart of Batel, it offers a sophisticated and cultured atmosphere with high-level live jazz performances, accompanied by signature cocktails and international cuisine.
- **Purple Reis** Located in São Francisco, this pub focuses on live blues and jazz with a relaxed environment and craft beers, close to the historic center.
- **Ponto Gin** A bar specialized in gin with signature cocktails, ideal for those seeking a modern and cosmopolitan setting.
- **Rua Itupava** and **Rua Vicente Machado** These are the main hubs for outdoor nightlife. **Itupava** features bars with outdoor seating and music, while **Vicente Machado** is famous for its street food and cocktail bars.

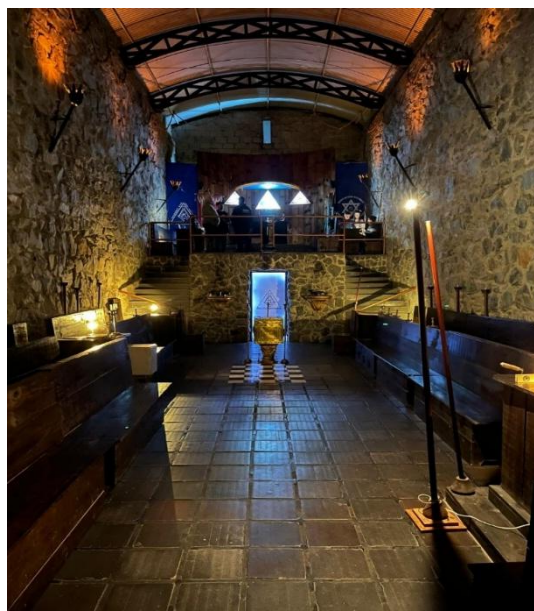

The Inter-American Confederation of Symbolic Masonry – **CIMAS**, faithful to its motto “**Ad Gloriam Universalis Fraternitatis**” (To the Glory of Universal Fraternity), has the honor of inviting your Respectable Obediences to participate in its XIII Meeting, which will be held from September 18 to 20, 2026, in the city of Curitiba, Brazil.

Within the scope of this XIII Meeting titled “LIVING FREEMASONRY,” we will hold our Colloquium, which will be governed by the following parameters:

CORE THEME

“Living Freemasonry in the First Quarter of the 21st Century: Its Challenges”

The first quarter of the 21st century presents profound social, technological, cultural, and ethical transformations. Faced with this scenario, Freemasonry is called to reflect on its historical mission, its formative role, and its responsibility in building a more just, free, and fraternal society.

Humanity enters the second quarter of the 21st century at an uncertain crossroads between Civilization and Barbarism. Freemasonry, as an essentially scientific, philanthropic, and cultural initiatory Order, is not indifferent to the fate of societies that were consolidated and expanded around the strong principles and values of Liberty, Equality, and Fraternity.

Throughout the first quarter of the 21st century, we have been going through a crisis that cannot be reduced exclusively to economic, institutional, or cyclical variables. We find ourselves facing a civilizational and existential crisis, characterized by the loss of collective horizons of meaning, the fragmentation of the social fabric, the discredit of traditional political projects, and the instrumentalization of the human being as a means rather than an end.

As an expression of Liberal and Progressive Freemasonry in the American Continent, it is our duty to take up our tools and constructive method with strength and vigor. Inspired by



our Tradition and the ideals that unite us, setting aside the interests and passions of the circles that polarize societies today, let us continue illuminating and generating a perspective of the future with hope and integration where the expression “human being” has meaning.

This Colloquium proposes to position the Freemasonry of the American Continent as a critical conscience of the present, faithful to its tradition of progress, but open to an honest review of the paradigms that have guided the social, political, and cultural life of the Continent.

Our general objective as the CIMAS Board is to provide a space for Masonic reflection that critically analyzes the challenges left by this first quarter of the century, which ended just a few months ago, in order to rethink the role of liberal Freemasonry as an ethical, pedagogical, and humanist agent in the construction of societies that are more just, free, fraternal, and spiritually significant.

Among the specific objectives of this Colloquium “Living Freemasonry in the First Quarter of the 21st Century: Its Challenges,” we can mention the following:

- Evaluate whether methods, languages, and work dynamics respond adequately to current challenges.
- Analyze, from a Masonic perspective, contemporary transformations and their impact on individual and collective consciousness.
- Reflect on the role of Freemasonry as a moral reference in societies marked by uncertainty and the relativization of values.
- Explore paths that allow for adaptation without losing identity or initiatory depth.
- Strengthen the bonds between Member and Guest Respectable Obediences, reinforcing a universal vision of the Order.
- Generate guidelines that allow Freemasonry to remain a living, coherent, and transformative force in the 21st century.

The presentations regarding the proposed theme “Living Freemasonry in the First Quarter of the 21st Century: Its Challenges” that our Dear Brothers and Sisters wish to present, whether individually or collectively, must be in Arial font size 12, with a maximum of two pages. Their presentation on September 19, 2026, in Curitiba, will follow the order in which they are received at the emails of the First and Second Secretary of CIMAS, Illustrious Brothers Juan Carlos Jiménez and Andy Villar: secretario@cimas-masoneria.com and 2secretario@cimas-masoneria.com, respectively. The deadline for receiving presentations is Sunday, August 30, 2026.



In the event that presentations are received at the aforementioned emails after August 30, their delivery will be subject to the remaining time within the established program. If they cannot be presented live, they will be included in the publication of the Colloquium that will follow.

We hope to meet again in Curituba, a beautiful city internationally recognized for its urban organization and commitment to sustainability, which will be the setting for this moment of fraternity where we, as Sisters and Brothers, will embrace each other once more.

Within the framework of the **9th Assembly of FASCREAA** and the **4th Meeting of the Supreme Councils members of CCJEHA**, which together with the **13th CIMAS Meeting** (Inter-American Confederation of Symbolic Masonry) will take place in **Curitiba, Brazil, between September 18 and 22, 2026**, we are pleased and honored to announce and invite you to participate in the **Scottish Colloquium**, which we are jointly coordinating as an important way to generate synergies.

The host of this event is the Supreme Council Francisco de Montezuma, to whom we already express our gratitude for the hospitality and fraternity in welcoming us.

Our societies and the world have changed greatly. Although we have kept pace with these times through current activities and topics with the participation of many Scottish Brothers and Sisters, it is also important to return to the sources to understand the principles that gave rise to Masonic philosophism. Therefore, we call on our Scottish Jurisdictions to actively participate in the Colloquium:

“290 years since the famous speech of Chevalier Michel de Ramsay, a founding and inspiring text of philosophical Scottishness:



¿What challenges and perspectives do Scottish Masons face in the reality of today's world?"

The Ramsay Speech, delivered on December 26, 1736 at the "Saint Thomas au Louis d'Argent" Lodge, profoundly marked the Masonry of its time, similar to the previous impact of Anderson's Constitutions. The second version, from March 1737, although never read, reinforced its influence in the emergence of Scottish degrees and in the development of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite (AASR) since 1801. Analyzing Chevalier Ramsay remains relevant for understanding current Scottishness, as his ideas were fundamental. Reviewing his principles today can offer new perspectives and strengthen **Universalist Humanism**, especially from a **Latin American perspective**.

We await official contributions from the Supreme Councils that so desire. Additionally, in accordance with our traditions, all Brothers and Sisters of our Jurisdictions may participate, provided they have the agreement of their authorities. The goal is to enrich our perspectives in a plural manner and with multi-disciplinary approaches, as our Scottishness remains open to all of them.

To give the Colloquium its due importance and allow all expressions to manifest freely, we have agreed to **dedicate a full day to this event**.
